



The church needs to hire two child care workers to provide care during church services and special events. If anyone in the congregation knows of any candidates, please have them contact the church office.

Pricing was researched for janitorial services. The Leadership Board identified a provider to start this week.


The Leadership board sees a need for a new building and grounds committee to deal with the issues that may arise. This new committee will hopefully take shape over the next few months.
