Dear Members and Friends of Central UMC,

This summer, we invite you to join us for a special 12-week worship series titled "Singing Our Faith." Starting on June 15 we will explore how the music we sing shapes what we believe, how we worship, and how we connect to the wider body of Christ across time and cultures. From timeless hymns and heartfelt spirituals to contemporary praise and sacred jazz, each week will focus on a different genre of sacred music and the theological truths it carries.

St. Augustine is often attributed as saying, "The one who sings prays twice." John and Charles Wesley embraced that idea and collaborated to create hymns we still in our church today. "The Wesleyan tradition was born in song and early Methodist people found their true identity as the children of God through singing."¹ This worship series will give us a chance to experience that truth in new and familiar ways. Together, we'll reflect on Scripture, deepen our understanding of worship, and celebrate the Spirit's movement through music.

We want your voice to help shape this series! On June 1 we'll be inviting everyone to complete a brief music survey—either online or in person. This is your chance to share the songs that have shaped your faith and the genres that stir your spirit. Please see page 3 for details on that survey.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

My mom and her two sisters moved to the area from Charlottesville for work, began attending, and joined Central Church. All three were married there in 1946.

As our older son once said of himself, he was "born at church," which was true for me as well. In 1948, I was christened at Central. As a child, I participated in the children's and youth choirs, attended Sunday School, and later joined the Methodist Youth Fellowship. I am still in contact with many from that group today. I joined Central in 1960.

Other ways I have volunteered include feeding the homeless on Fridays, helping at bazaars, funeral and wedding receptions, serving as Council on Ministries chair, participating in the worship committee and choir, setting up for communion, and helping with monthly mailings. I now help as Reader of the Word. I also participated in EMMAUS, with Richard and Carroll Cobb as my sponsors. I can't forget my 50-year friendship with my Circle 7 sisters. We have supported each other through good and bad times.

Steve and I were married on the same day of the week (Sunday), date (June 29th), and hour (3 P.M.) as my parents—only 23 years later—at Central. On June 29, 2019, we renewed our vows and had a reception to celebrate our 50th anniversary, complete with a cake that looked like our wedding cake from 50 years earlier. About 75 people attended. It was probably the last big event in the old church.

At one time, I was one of four generations that belonged to Central. My great aunt, Elizabeth Bragg, was at one point the church historian; my mom, Louise Hood, got me involved with Methodist Women; then myself, and our two sons (Steven and Jeffrey), who were also christened at Central.

I have watched the church transform its building twice in my lifetime. The original church had outside steps that went straight to the county sidewalk. Then, most of the steps were inside. And now, we worship in our beautiful new building. Each change has been an improvement. I am happy to worship here.

In my lifetime, I have formed many friendships with people at Central. I have seen many come and go, but we all shared one common bond: the desire to worship our Lord.


